


How do families become partners with Chester Elementary School?

- Reviewing a particular skill with your child







SRBI Process Scientific Research- Based Intervention



What is the SRBI process?

The Scientific Research-Based Intervention (SRBI) Process is a general education initiative that provides assistance to teachers and support to students experiencing difficulties with learning or behavior. It employs a collaborative team model.

The goal of SRBI is to intervene early and provide support and assistance to teachers through a collaborative approach.

Issues that might initiate SRBI include but are not limited to:

- Academic difficulties
- Inappropriate behavior
- Social/emotional concerns

Tiered Levels of Intervention

Tiered Intervention occurs throughout the SRBI process. All children receive differentiated instruction. If a child does not respond, the duration and frequency of intervention increases.

- Tier 1—Classroom Differentiation
- Tier 2—Targeted Intervention
- Tier 3—Intensive Intervention

Each tier includes a goal and timeline for completion.

What happens during SRBI?

The teacher discusses the concerns with the child's parents. The teacher also informs the SRBI team of these concerns.



The SRBI facilitator, teacher and team brainstorm and choose new strategies to be implemented within a set period of time. These may include:

- Observe the student
- Collect data
- Provide differentiated support
- Document progress



The teacher then meets with the SRBI team again to:

- Review progress
- Continue or modify interventions
- Close successful cases
- Seek additional support if necessary

The SRBI Team

The SRBI Team is a school-based team that develops targeted strategies or interventions that will address learning and/or behavioral concerns.

As part of the decision making process, the SRBI Team utilizes student performance data and observation.

The SRBI Team includes the principal, language arts consultant, math coach, reading teacher, early interventionist, school psychologist, counselor, and speech and language pathologist.
